REGULATED ACCESS TO THE COMPETITION SITE (CLUB HIPPIQUE DE NICE)

**COMPULSORY HEALTH PASS** in France for indoor and outdoor sports sites:

As of Thursday, September 30, 2021, **people 12 years old and over must provide a valid Health Pass** .

The Health Pass will be checked by the OC using the "TousAntiCovid Verif" application: verification of the QR code (paper or digital format) validity for the person wishing to enter the Club Hippique de Nice.

The Health Pass is valid if it contains at least one of the following:

- Proof of a complete vaccination schedule\*
- Negative RT-PCR, antigen less than 72 hours,
- Certificate of recovery from COVID-19 for at least 11 days and less than 6 months.

\* Complete vaccination schedule:  
- Two weeks after the second shot for two-shot vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca);  
- Four weeks after the shot for one-shot vaccines (Johnson & Johnson);  
- Two weeks after the shot for vaccines administered to people who have already had COVID-19 (only one dose is necessary).

GENERAL BEHAVIORS INSIDE THE COMPETITION SITE (CLUB HIPPIQUE DE NICE)

**WEARING A MASK:** Wearing a mask is compulsory throughout the Club Hippique de Nice venue, for all persons aged 12 and over, exception of athletes mounted on a horse.

ACCES REGLEMENTES AU SITE DE LA COMPETITION (CLUB HIPPIQUE DE NICE)

**PASSE SANITAIRE OBLIGATOIRE** dans les établissements sportifs couverts et de plein air :

A compter du jeudi 30 septembre 2021, **les personnes âgées de 12 ans et plus accueillies doivent présenter un Passe Sanitaire valide.**

Le contrôle du Passe Sanitaire s'effectue par l'OC via l'application "TousAntiCovid Verif" : vérification de la validité du QR code (papier ou numérique) de toute personne souhaitant entrer au sein du Club Hippique de Nice.

Le Passe Sanitaire est valide s'il contient au moins l'un des éléments suivants :

- Justificatif d'un schéma vaccinal complet\*
- Test Négatif RT-PCR, antigénique de moins de 72h,
- Certificat de rétablissement de la COVID-19 depuis au moins 11 jours et moins de 6 mois.

\* Schéma vaccinal complet :  
- Deux semaines après la deuxième injection pour les vaccins à deux injections (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca) ;  
- Quatre semaines après l'injection pour les vaccins à injection unique (Johnson & Johnson) ;  
- Deux semaines après l'injection pour les vaccins administrés aux personnes ayant déjà eu le COVID-19 (uniquement une dose est nécessaire).

COMPORTEMENTS AU SEIN DU SITE DE LA COMPETITION (CLUB HIPPIQUE DE NICE)

**PORT DU MASQUE :** Le port du masque est obligatoire sur l'ensemble de l'enceinte du Club Hippique de Nice, pour toutes les personnes âgées de 12 ans et plus, sauf à cheval.

**OTHER SANITARY RULES:**

- Comply with the health rules regarding physical distancing and markings when walking throughout the Club Hippique de Nice venue.
- Respect all health measures
- Use of dedicated bins for sanitary waste (masks, disposable tissues, etc.).
- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water or with hydro alcoholic gel
- You will have to respect the signage present at the event

**Equipment** to have in your truck, boxes, stables:

- Masks for all participants
- Hydro alcoholic gel
- All your necessary equipment (no lending is allowed between competitors on the field)

**On arrival and during the competition:**

- Wear a mask whether I am a rider, coach, groom, or owner (if over 11 years old).
- Walk the courses: only riders and their coach are allowed to, accompanying persons will not be allowed in the arena.
- Riders must respect the rules specified in the prize giving ceremonies guideline (no handshakes, etc...)
- We are going to promote the use of digital start lists, you will find start lists & results on [www.nicecheval.com](http://www.nicecheval.com)
- Signage will specify the maximum people admitted at the same time per office, if the office is full, you will need to wait outside the office respecting the physical distance.
- One accompanying person per rider is allowed at the warm-up jumps. (for Jumping competitions)
- We kindly ask the participants to leave the warm-up areas as soon as possible after their performance.

**AUTRES MESURES SANITAIRES :**

- Les compétiteurs doivent respecter les règles précisées dans le règlement de remise des prix (pas de poignée de main, etc...)
- Nous allons promouvoir l'utilisation des listes de départ numériques, vous trouverez les listes de départ et les résultats sur [www.nicecheval.com](http://www.nicecheval.com)
- La signalisation précisera le nombre maximum de personnes admises en même temps secrétariat, si le secrétariat est complet, vous devrez patienter à l'extérieur du bureau en respectant la distanciation physique.
- Un accompagnateur par cavalier est autorisé aux sauts d'échauffement. (pour les CSI)
- Nous demandons aux participants de quitter les zones d'échauffement dès que possible après leur performance.

**Spectators/ riders / accompanying persons:**

- We suggest to all our participants to use the "TousAntiCovid" application.
- We advise all the participants to avoid group of more than 6
- Switch as much as possible to contactless payment

**DOGS:**

We remind you that dogs are not allowed in the stables and catering areas. They must be kept on a leash throughout the rest of the site.

FOR OBVIOUS REASONS OF RESPECT AND GOOD MANNERS, WE ALSO REMIND OWNERS THAT IT IS NECESSARY TO PICK UP AFTER THEIR DOGS ON THE ENTIRE SITE

(FEI rules, Art ; 109.13 GRs : Tous les chiens doivent être tenus en laisse et attachés à un humain ou à un objet fixe. La violation de cette règle entraînera une amende de CHF 100 par infraction et, en cas de récidive lors de la manifestation, pourra entraîner l'exclusion du site).

### **III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX and Annex IX: For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

### **5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE**

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a postmortem examination.

### **6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES**

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both

their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

**7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE**

**7.1 PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations Article 137**

**For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.**

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (GRs 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

**NB** for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

**7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1003**

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

**7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031**

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

**7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1034-1042**

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

**7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1048-1053**

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

**8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP). FEI Regulations, Chapter VII**

**8.1 SAMPLING. FEI Veterinary Regulations Chapter VII**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMPs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

**8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1058**

### XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

The OC shall submit the risk assessment and mitigation plan (including name and contact details of the person in charge) to the FEI as an annex to the Event Schedule, **at the latest ten (10) working days before the event's deadline for Definite Entries.**

Events for which the FEI has not received the documented risk assessment and mitigation measures plan in accordance with article 2.1.g) of the Policy **will be removed from the FEI calendar** in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.

#### **ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY**

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
2. The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,

3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("RELEASEES"), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.

## **2. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

### **2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL**

#### **2.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance**

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

#### **2.1.2 Personal Property Insurance**

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have

an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

### **2.1.3 Press Equipment**

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

## **2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS**

### **2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance**

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

### **2.2.2 Additional Liability Information**

### **2.2.3 Horse Insurance**

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

## **3. PROTESTS/APPEALS**

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

## **5. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the Approval of the Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and Officials

as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

**6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER**

Art 109.13 GRs: All dogs must be leashed and affixed to a human or stationary object. Violation of this rule will incur a fine of CHF 100 per offence and, in case of a repeated offence at the Event, may lead to exclusion from the Venue  
Trucks and vans will be parked outside the competition field.

**DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS:**

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

The settlement of amounts owed by the organising committee for foreign riders will be based forward Art.130.2. Gains will be distributed, at the latest, at the end of the last race of the competition.

The Art. 30.II of the Finance Act for 1990, amending Ar. 182.B in January 1990, exposes persons domiciled outside France for artistic or athletic, supplied or used in France, restraint the specific source of 15% subject to the provisions of the international Conventions.

To be exempted from it, rider should provide a certificate proving a payment of its taxes in France. Without it, this taxes must be paid

The OC could also pay prize money by bank transfer. An Iban / Particulars of bank account will be necessary

**IMPORTANT**

**The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations articles 127 and 128)**

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money announced for the competition. Distribution of prize money: distributed to 25 % of participants. If there are between 5 and 19 athletes in the competition, min 5 prizes must be distributed.

If there are 4 or less athletes in the competition, the table below applies.
